



Background Save the Children is a non-political, non-governmental organization dedicated to promoting child rights. Our vision is to create a world where every child has the right to survival, protection, development, and participation. Since 1951, Save the Children Somalia country office has been working in Somalia implementing humanitarian and development programs in five key sectors: child poverty reduction, child survival, child rights governance, child education, and child protection.	

2. Introduction:

Save the Children

Natural disasters pose a significant threat to the populations in our target locations, including the Somali people in general, and can have devastating humanitarian consequences. The increase in extreme weather events caused by climate change exacerbates existing vulnerabilities and negatively impacts the livelihoods of poor communities, leading to loss of life, livelihoods, and displacement. Further impacts of the disaster are felt on infrastructure, health, and education services, and increased child protection risks. To address these challenges, Save the Children Somalia country office is currently implementing Reducing Impacts of Disasters Using the Anticipatory Action Framework project in HirShabelle State (Beletwyene Hiran Region) in collaboration with relevant agencies in line with national plans and priorities. This project is funded by German Federal Foreign Office (GFFO). The project focuses on strengthening local and national systems and capacities in early warning and anticipatory action programming. It provides valuable learning opportunities for anticipatory action, disaster preparedness, early warning systems, data collection, and trigger development for anticipatory action. The region of the project Hiran) serve as a suitable case study to understand how anticipatory action can shift the focus from reacting to hazards to actively anticipating them in the context of a protracted crisis. To monitor the humanitarian situation throughout the year, the project utilized Household Economic Analysis (HEA) and Cost of Diet (CotD) and monitoring of early warning. By using available and updated baselines, Save the Children is currently conducting an outcome analysis across four distinct livelihood zones. This exercise aims to provide comprehensive insights into the humanitarian situation throughout the year. Following this analysis, a cost of diet exercise will be undertaken to generate impact-based forecast information, which will help inform more effective interventions. The combined data will support evidence-based decision-making to improve food security and nutritional outcomes for vulnerable populations in these areas.

Additionally, to strengthen local and national systems and capacities in early warning and anticipatory action programming, the Somali Disaster Management Agency (SoDMA) and the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management (MOHADMA) play a central role in managing and coordinating humanitarian responses and disaster management across Somalia. In recent years, the country has experienced an increasing number of climate-related hazards such as droughts and floods, coupled with ongoing political and socio-economic challenges. Early Warning and Early Action (EWEA) systems, which allow for the timely detection of risks and the proactive response to prevent or mitigate disasters, are crucial in this context.

However, the government leadership in coordinating anticipatory actions remains limited across Federal Government and Federal Members States. The need to understand the capacity of SoDMA, and MOHADMA in coordinating and executing anticipatory actions is not yet fully realised. The need for technical support needs to be grounded on an assessment of their capacity in terms of structures and systems in order to strengthen coordination systems and enhance coordination of funding for anticipatory actions. This technical ToR outlines the framework for assessing these needs, providing training, and establishing systems that ensure inclusive local leadership in managing disaster risks and facilitating anticipatory actions.

2. Objectives of the Assignment

The overall objective of this assignment is to assess the institutional and technical capacities of SoDMA and MOHADMA on the coordination of Anticipatory Action (AA). This is aimed at facilitating the establishment of government-owned coordination of anticipatory action, including funding mechanisms that support anticipatory actions at the community level.

Specific Objectives are.



- Assess the structures of the government coordination that supports anticipatory actions.
- Assess the capacity of these structures and how they relate to the community levels.
- Develop strategies to strengthen SoDMA, MOHADMA, and key stakeholders at the local and national levels.

3. Scope of Work

The consultant firm will facilitate the assessment work within three geographic areas of Somaliland, Puntland and Southern state with focus on:

1. Southern State with a focus on Beledweyne

The Federal Government and Federal Member States agencies will focus on collaboration with the Disaster Management Agencies or Climate and Environment Ministries including but not limited to:

- 1. Federal Government of Somalia, primarily SODMA
- 2. Hirshabelle with a focus on Hiraan, especially the Ministry of Humanitarians and Disaster Management (MoHADM)

Meanwhile the local level coordination will focus primarily on the selected districts of the project. This is outlined as follows:

1. Beledweyne district

However, if the regional government structures is deemed important, the consultant will ensure that they assess the structures within the region. The following regions will be priorities for this assessment.

1. Hiraan Region

Community level coordination structures including the Community Disaster Management Committees will be assessed in terms of coordination roles, capacity and linkages with the districts, regional and or national disaster management structures.

4. Expected Deliverables

- **Inception Report**: Detailed work plan, methodology, and timeline for conducting the assessment and delivering the outputs.
- An analysis of coordination structures which has the potential for supporting the local leadership of anticipatory actions
- Strategy of how to improve the local leadership in coordination of the anticipatory action structures including the capacity requirements such as technical, equipment and logistical arrangments



5. Duration of Assignment

The assignment is expected to be completed within 45 days and the consultant/firm is expected to carry out all the deliverables as follows; one weeks for the inception report, four weeks for the needs assessments and capacity building training and one week for the final report.
